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SUMMARY

My long-term vision is to make a key contribution to health systems strengthening in low resource settings especially to advance mental health and HIV care for children and adolescents. My research, clinical practice, and training in health services delivery is diverse, and has adequately prepared me for leadership and technical roles in public health research and program management. My current position is of a Senior Research Scientist at the Kenyatta National Hospital (KNH). My training is in Medicine & Surgery, Global Health, Epidemiology, Implementation Science and Information & Technology. In the last decade, I have been involved in designing and managing >20 research projects in HIV prevention, testing, treatment and treatment support, and infectious disease surveillance in Kenya, Nigeria, Uganda, Malawi, Zimbabwe and South Africa. I have methods expertise in Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Implementation Science and quality improvement. I also have >10-year experience offering clinical care in rural and urban public and private settings, and in stakeholder management, having worked with the Ministries of Health in Kenya and Nigeria, and Ministries of Education, County health departments, implementing partners, facility leadership and frontline health providers. This background and experience has enabled me develop a unique perspective on the health care needs for Kenya and appropriate, adaptable solutions.

Highlights of my research work include studies on index case testing for the children and adolescents, implementation strategies for community roll-out of HIV self-testing among adolescents in Kenya, development of tools to guide transition of adolescents from pediatric to independent care; these studies directly informed HIV testing and treatment guidelines and policies in Kenya. In my current research, we are studying social factors in adolescent HIV, including HIV stigma and disclosure of HIV status. I am also leading implementation science research on viral load monitoring and mental health assessments, care and referral for children and adolescents with HIV. My publication record includes ~60 papers published in high impact journals.

Beyond grant writing, I lead mentorship of junior researchers at KNH- including clinical staff at the hospital, students and faculty at the University of Nairobi (UoN), and research project staff affiliated with KNH. I lead a team of ~15 mid-level scientists affiliated to KNH, UoN and the University of Washington (UW) in offering mentorship to researchers developing research proposals for funding by KNH and other mentored grants offered by UW, Centers for AIDS Research; and fellowships funded by the US National Institutes of Health's Fogarty International Center. I also lead manuscript and conference abstract writing workshops in collaboration with mid-career and senior researchers at KNH, UoN, and UW. Specifically, I am currently mentoring 3 PhD students at the University of Nairobi, Implementation Science program, and primary mentor to 4 fellows under the NIH Fogarty-funded Global Health Fellows Program, and supporting thesis development for 4 students at the University of Washington Global Health department funded by Fogarty's D43 award on Women and HIV in Kenya.
